SCOPE OF SERVICES: Dominican University will continue to provide graduate level courses leading to a Masters degree in Special Services for approximately 11 bilingual and bicultural individuals holding transitional Bilingual Individual Teacher Provisional Certificates who have been placed into vacant Special Education positions in the Chicago Public Schools.

DELIVERABLES:

Dominican University will provide for all Participants, five (5) cohort courses totaling 10 credit hours. Dominican University will provide for 10 cohort participants (five prior holders of a Masters Degree in Special Education and five new Participants) the 6 credit hour Clinical Practice in Special Education (student teaching) that these Participants need for their Masters Degree in Special Education.

Participants will continue to be staffed into vacant special education positions within the Chicago Public Schools. Participants who have signed agreements which commit them to work in special education for the Chicago Public Schools will be expected to complete their Masters Degree in Special Education or fail to complete their Masters Degree within the specified time frame.

OUTCOMES:

The following outcomes are expected: Participants who complete their Masters Degree in Special Education will be eligible for employment in the Chicago Public Schools. Participants who fail to complete their Masters Degree in Special Education will not be eligible for employment in the Chicago Public Schools.
