LSC election will be held in 2008 unless the IAC submits a request for the Board to approve Pershing West an alternative school and to establish an alternative

Reporting Structure:

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

The Board has created the Performance School as an operating unit of the Board pursuant to its authority under the Illinois School Code to create and operate schools. The relationship between the Board and the Performance School is statutory and not contractual.

The Performance School shall operate a high quality instructional program serving the educational needs of the students enrolled. The curriculum established by the Performance



- B. Permanent Governance Alternative Local School Councils

If the Performance School selects an ALSC as its form of governance, it must submit an application to the Board seeking classification as an alternative or small school under section 105 Consistent with the Renaissance Schools Policy and applicable State law, the Performance school's IAC may recommend selection of the school's interim principal to the Chief Executive Officer and to submit evaluations of the interim principal's performance.

The Performance School will be managed by an interim principal until a permanent governing body is formed.




ACCOUNTABILITY PLAN FOR PERSHING WEST SCHOOL OF THE HUMANITIES





