This Act recognizes that a school nurse may not be in a school full-time, and therefore, provides for the identification and training of a Delegated Care Aide (DCA) for every student with diabetes.

The DCA does not take the place of a nurse and will assist a student with diabetes in the event the school nurse is not available.
